





What is Tokyo's budget?



The estimated revenues and expenditures for one year are compiled in a budget. The Tokyo Metropolitan Government (TMG) uses the taxes paid by the residents of Tokyo to provide administrative services, including disaster mitigation and welfare measures.

How big is the budget?

The same size as some national budgets **15.2 trillion yen**

Account type	FY2021 Budget	Remarks
Total account	JPY 15.2T	
General account	JPY 7.4T	For administrative services such as disaster mitigation and welfare measures, based on taxes
Special accounts	JPY 5.8T	For specific objectives such as management of metropolitan housing
Public enterprise accounts	JPY 1.9T	For water supply and sewerage and other enterprises managed by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government






- **An increase for the first time in two years, with the launch of 430 new projects**



- **Approximately 80 billion yen increase** due to, among others, increased project costs for programs to open up the future of Tokyo



- **Decrease of about 400 billion yen** due to, among others, reduced revenue from corporate taxes caused by worsening corporate earnings, etc.



The budget **focuses** on initiatives to achieve **early social and economic recovery**, and measures to **open up the future of Tokyo**.



Seven Pillars of the FY2021 Budget

Strategic initiatives to open up the future of Tokyo and major initiatives for the early recovery of society and economy, which were severely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, are positioned within the seven pillars of the budget.

A city where people shine and everyone can play an active role



Key new and expanded projects

- Tokyo Childbirth Support Program : Don't get beaten by COVID-19
- Supporting long-term care prevention activities and other services utilizing online tools
- Supporting early reemployment using temporary staffing services etc.



The world's safest, most secure, convenient, and comfortable city

Protect the people of Tokyo from threats such as disasters and diseases, and create a city with advanced urban functions and transportation networks



Key new and expanded projects

- Constructing new regulating reservoirs (Shakujii River basin and Kanda River basin) as a measure for heavy rainfall disasters
- Accelerating efforts for removal of utility poles
- Managing the Tokyo i CDC Expert Board etc.



Realize a highly productive city where people, goods, money, and information gather from all over the world and new industries emerge one after another




Key new and expanded projects



Key new and expanded projects


- Installing smart poles extensively in the Nishi-Shinjuku area to induce urban implementation of 5G services

Hosting the 2020 Games and creating a legacy



Promotion of the Tama area and Tokyo islands






Key new and expanded projects

- Establishing an immersive English education facility in the Tama area
- Introducing furniture and fixtures made of wood from the Tama area in the TMG building and other metropolitan facilities
- Implementing pilot projects using digital technology to solve social issues in the Tokyo islands etc.

Promotion of project review

Efforts to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of projects

- ✓ Published project review **1,360 cases**
- ✓ Finances secured **111 billion yen**



Utilization of funds

Money is set aside in funds for future expenditure increases and other needs

- ✓ Withdrawals from funds: **829.0 billion yen**, including **750.2 billion yen** from the funds to achieve the "three cities" (safe city, smart city, diverse city)



Utilizing Tokyo Metropolitan Bonds

To adjust financial resources between fiscal years and strive for intergenerational equity


- ✓ Tokyo bonds issued: **587.6 billion yen**
Of which ESG bonds issued were about **100 billion yen**
 - Green bonds: **40 billion yen**
 - Social bonds: **60 billion yen**




I look forward to seeing Tokyo change with the start of these projects. But how did Tokyo **secure its financial resources** when metropolitan tax revenues are declining?

- Both the number of the published projects and the amount of finances secured are the highest ever, as a result of efforts including constant review of measures and the elimination of wasteful spending.




- Actively utilize funds for realization of the “three cities” to steadily advance preparations for the Tokyo 2020 Games and other measures



- Expand the issuance of ESG bonds, which are attracting brisk investment by the financial sector to support the realization of the SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals)

* ESG bonds: Bonds issued for investors that take into account environmental, social, and governance factor



Good point, Hari! In addition to reviewing its projects, Tokyo has been resourcefully using funds that have been systematically accumulated, and Tokyo metropolitan bonds.
